


Fig1 Represents Percentage of responses on Question 1.

The results to Question 1 are presented below in diagram as shown in Fig.1




Fig 2 Represents Percentage of responses on Question 2.




Fig 3 Represents Percentage of responses on Question 3.

The results to Question 3 are presented below in diagram as shown in Fig.3




Fig 4 Represents Percentage of responses on Question 4.

The results to Question 4 are presented below in diagram as shown in Fig.4




Fig 5 Represents Percentage of responses on Question 5.
