Institution has created an eco system for innovations including Incubation centre and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge.

An eco system has been created in the institution to promote innovation, transfer of knowledge and entrepreneurship. As part of innovation, SSTian Innovation and Business incubation Center (SIBIC) has been set up in the year 2011-2012 for nurturing innovative ideas from the students. Initial amount has been sanctioned by Trust to establish SIBIC in the institution for 11 years starting from the academic year 2011-12. As part of this initiative, Ideation contests were conducted every year. The students participated in large number and showed enthusiasm towards innovation and its practice. The institute provided necessary facilities and financial support upto to carry out each of these projects. A Committee consisting of experts from diverse fields representing industry, banking and other allied areas are involved in the short listing of innovative ideas for pursuing further.

As part of choice based education system, the students are encouraged to take up co- curricular activities involving project based learning which culminate into creation of innovative knowledge helpful for the society. Students are encouraged to take up research projects as part of their semester V and Semester VI project work. Students are encouraged to take up and participate in code development activities such as Hackthons and Coding contests etc., which train the students towards innovation.

Faculty is encouraged to conduct research activities and make publications in the journals of repute for knowledge sharing. The institution has the practice of conducting various workshops and conferences periodically for creation and sharing of knowledge. They are also encouraged to contribute to national and international conferences conducted outside the institution as part of this initiative. Similarly some of the faculty members have published technical books as a part of initiative for knowledge creation and transfer. The faculty has been encouraged to take up Intellectual Property rights as an initiative towards innovation and knowledge sharing. The faculty delivers guest lectures and expert lectures to other institutions as part of knowledge sharing.

The club has organized many programs for students and faculty students in activities including formulation of business plans, sourcing of funds for projects and managing various dimensions of business such as purchase, production, inventory, accounting, marketing and quality control, designing and reporting. In collaboration with the Ecology “ Best out of Waste”, Program was conducted. Students collected waste materials , recycled and converted to T- Shirts and sold out in the campus.

Energy Swaraj Foundation organized a Boot Camp for 600 students and 40 faculty collaborating with SSTian SIBIC (SSTian Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Cell). They gained hands on experience in various dimensions of designing a Solar System.







Abstract

Authentication is a process of verifying whether the user is valid or not for the requested service is known as authentication. It is a process of granting a user access to an information system, most commonly used is user-name password. There are three many types of authentication techniques or types such as local storage and comparison, central storage and comparison, challenge and response, Kerberos, one-time password, certification based, biometric, smart cards. Each authentication mechanism functions differently and has their strengths and weakness. In this paper we review different types of authentication techniques, how they work and what methods they use to prevent from several attacks or malicious activities.

The most well-known authentication method is User ID and password. 'Authentication' is the process that gets you access to whatever system, data stream or application that you are requesting.

While a password may be sufficient to secure simple accounts like social media profiles or other online communities, the truth is that many of us store more sensitive information online.

Authentication is the process of establishing and confirming the identity of a client requesting services. It's composed of two parts: a public statement of identity (usually in the form of username) combined with a private response to a challenge (such as a password).



- i) COLLEGE will undergo the NSQF aligned MESC courses.
- j) COLLEGE will arrange Training of Trainers.
- k) There will be no financial role of MESC in arrangement between COLLEGE and the Industry body.
- l) COLLEGE will pay the assessment fee to MESC.

Roles and Responsibility of MESC

- a) To assist COLLEGE in aligning the curriculum with the identified Media and Entertainment qualification packs and national occupational standards for B-Voc, BSC, BA and other Course Curriculum related to Media and Entertainment.
- b) To facilitate training of trainers and help in provisioning of Master Trainers from the industry, on as required basis.
- c) Develop industry linkages to enable the students to have practical training and skill development on the job.
- d) To ensure quality of training delivery by adopting stringent accreditation process for training service providers, assessments and certification of trainees.
- e) To conduct assessment and issue certificate.
- f) Assessment will be carried out as per the QP progression matrix aligned to NSQF.

Changes / Amendment:





Installation of Solar Panels

The college has installed solar energy system which is a step towards reinforcing carbon credits and identifying and removing potential barriers in using solar energy resources. The college has already installed 50KW solar panels in the first phase for load of 30 KW i.e. the total energy requirement of the college. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets the terms and understanding between Kelley, Lane and Chiplunkar (hereby mentioned as the "Research Team") and S.S.T. College of Arts and Commerce (hereby mentioned as the "College") to explore mutually beneficial academic research about labour force participation of final year university students.

There are no legal implications of this MOU.

Background

We are a team of researchers in development and labor economics from the World Bank, American University and University of Virginia. We have collaborated on projects with companies around the world—Kenya, India, Bangladesh, and the United States. Our work focuses on job-search and firm dynamics. We have extensive experience running randomized control trials and analyzing large, spatio-temporal datasets. We have spent the last three years working with job portals, SMEs and skill assessment companies and the NSDC in India.

Objective

The purpose of this research is to investigate how to boost labor force participation among Indian youth. The main hypothesis we would like to test is whether providing more support to young adults through employability and soft skills programs, achieves this objective. To this end, we have partnered with Talerang to train students in their final year of college on specific job employability skills.

The "Research Team" agrees to the following commitments:

1. We are a team of researchers that have raised independent funds to provide job-employability training free of charge. **These programs require no financial commitments from your college or your students.**

2. We have partnered with Talerang, a leader in the provision of career training to students and professionals across India. Talerang will oversee the introduction of their trademark employability and soft skills programs designed to facilitate job acquisition.
3. Talerang has trained facilitators that will travel to the "College" to provide scientifically designed job training modules to your students.
4. The program will provide a subset of the student participants with a weekly feed (over a period of 4 weeks) of job vacancies which will be suited to their profile and interests.
5. These programs will be conducted at the "College" premises with the aim of increasing the likelihood of appropriate placements for students.
6. The "Research Team" will then conduct detailed surveys with your students to determine the benefits of these programs on the students. **We will share our finding with the "College".**

The "College" agrees to the following commitments:

1. **Pre-training commitments**
 - a. Providing a register of all final year students across degree courses for which the training will be implemented.
 - b. Informing students that the program is mandatory and ensuring that students turn up on the day of the training.
 - c. Organizing registration camp at campus where all students should register themselves for the training.
 - d. Facilitating data collection activities:
 - i. Facilitate the organisation of a first survey (a "baseline survey") at least one month before the training date – "Research Team" to conduct baseline survey with all students on some date before the main training.
 - e. Setting up a strong communication point between the "College" and the "Research Team". These individuals from the "College" will be responsible for coordinating logistics.
2. **Post-training commitments**
 - a. Facilitating data collection activities:
 - i. Organising follow-up surveys for training participants - on a predetermined day every 2 weeks, students to gather in the computer lab to complete follow-up surveys
 - b. Ensuring that students remain responsive over the entire program period of about 2 months - which includes the baseline survey, the training session, and the post training engagement (job information and follow-up surveys).
 - i. In this regard, the "College" may want to incentivise students by using levers like attendance, grace marks, refundable deposits, etcetera
3. **Allow the "Research Team" to collect data**
 - a. Collect information on students' job search patterns and behavior on the job market through baseline, midline and endline surveys.

On Completion of their Graduation in 2022 they would be provided Placement Assistance through Kotak Education Foundation.



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




Introduction

- Java is the most popular class-based, object-oriented, high-level programming language.
- Developed by James Gosling at Sun Microsystems and released in 1995 as a core component of Sun Microsystems' Java platform.
- Derives much of its syntax from C and C++.
- Is typically compiled to bytecode (class file). It can be run on any Java Virtual Machine (JVM) regardless of the architecture.
- Is specifically designed to have few implementation dependencies.
- Is intended to let application developers write a code that runs on one platform & does not need to be recompiled to run on another.

Java has characteristics of Object-Oriented languages

- **Inheritance:** Creating new classes & extending them to reuse the existing code and adding new features as needed.
- **Encapsulation:** combining the information and hiding the abstraction.
- **Polymorphism:** Providing different functionality by the functions having the same name, based on the signatures of the methods.
- **Dynamic binding:** Providing maximum functionality to a program about the specific type at runtime.

Features

Platform independence: Key feature of Java language is write-once-run-anywhere (WORA) concept. With Java, you can run the code written on any system.

Simplicity: Programs are easy to write and debug. Java provides a bug-free system due to strong memory management.

Portability: Java feature write-once-run-anywhere makes it portable, provided that the system has an interpreter for JVM. Also, Java has standard data size irrespective of the OS or the processor.

Performance: Uses native code and lightweight process called threads. The advance version of JVM uses adaptive and just-in-time compilation technique to improve the total performance.

Distributed: Widely used protocols like HTTP and FTP are developed in Java. Internet programmers can call functions on these protocols and can access the files from any remote machine on the internet, rather than writing codes on their local system.

Secure:

- Programs in Java run under an area known as the sandbox.
- Security manager determines the accessibility options of a class like reading and writing a file to the local disk.
- Uses public key encryption system to allow the java applications to transmit over the internet in a secure and encrypted form.
- The bytecode verifier checks the classes after loading.

Robust:

- Java has
- Strong memory allocation.
- Automatic garbage collection mechanism.
- Powerful exception handling.
- Type-checking mechanism.
- A compiler that checks the program for any errors and interprets the code, catching the errors and makes the program run smoothly without crashing.

HTML is written in the form of HTML elements consisting of tags, enclosed in angle brackets, within the web page content. The purpose of a web browser is to read HTML documents and compose them into visible or audible web pages. The browser does not display the HTML tags, but uses the tags to interpret the content of the page.

- It provides a means to create structured documents by denoting structural semantics for text such as headings, paragraphs, lists, links, quotes and other items.
- It can embed scripts in languages such as JavaScript which affect the behaviour of HTML webpages.
- Web browsers can also refer to Cascading Style Sheets (CSS) to define the appearance and layout of text and other material.
- The W3C, maintainer of both the HTML and the CSS standards, encourages the use of CSS over explicitly presentational HTML markup.
