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








REPORT ON BARCLAYS BANK



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

In B.Com Accounting and Finance department certificate courses are GST and Accounting Standards.



Finally, the resource person responded to all the doubts of the students and the session ended by vote of thanks.










SUMMARY REPORT ON SY-FC PROJECT GUIDANCE

The chapter covered in NCC are National Integration & Awareness ,Drill: Foot Drill , Adventure Training and Environment Awareness and Conservation, Personality Development and Leadership, Specialized subject (ARMY), Disaster Management, Social Awareness and Community Development, Health and Hygiene, Drill with Arms, Weapon Training, Specialized Subject: Army Or Navy Or Air.

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In physical education the chapters going to study are Overview of Nutrition, Evaluation of Health, Fitness and Wellness, Prevention and Care of Exercise Injuries, Sports Training, Stress Management, Awards, Scholarship & Government Schemes, Yoga Education, Exercise Scheduling/Prescription



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








SUMMARY REPORT ON INDUCTION PROGRAMME














SUMMARY REPORT ON VISIT TO NISM




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SUMMARY REPORT ON PROJECT GUIDANCE TO TYBAF




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








SUMMARY REPORT ON ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON "BASICS **OF TALLY ERP9"**
