Summary Report

The Department of Arts, SST College, organized a Seminar on ‘**The Preparation for Competitive Exams**’ in the College premises on 11th September 2018 at 11 am. Asst. Prof. Jeevan Vichare, Vice Principal, SST College, was the Chief Guest for the day. The program began with the lamp lighting ceremony followed by the deliverance of welcome address by Asst. Prof. Sambhaji Khandekar, Department of Political Science. The chief speaker, Asst. Prof. Anna Patil, was introduced to the gathering by Asst. Prof. Tushar wakse. The Speaker is a well-experienced trainer at the competitive exams Coaching Center, apart from being a soft skill trainer.

The speaker was then invited to deliver the lecture, which was spread across two sessions with a break in between. The speaker chose to emphasize two main components of Competitive exams in the country, namely the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) and the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) respectively. The speaker served as a ray of optimism for the students by ushering in the success stories of a few IAS officers. Before elaborating on the main subject of the lecture, he explained the placebo effect, which served as an appetizer before the main course. Followed by the bouts of motivation, the speaker threw light on the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) and stressed on the intricacies of it, such as the Qualifications, Number of Attempts, Reservations, Cut-off marks and the total number of services which come under it. He also elaborately discussed the Exam Cycle, which takes an entire year to complete. He made the inquisitive students learn how to apply for the exam. He passed on a list of sources to refer for preparation to the staff members from whom the students could collect. The students listened vividly when he explained the marking system for the exam. He instructed the students to follow the three R’s- Read, Revise, Recollect, required to succeed in the exams. He wanted the students to stick to the basics and be consistent in whatever endeavor they undertook. He preached the importance of having Conceptual Clarity to the listeners. He maintained that the Blueprint Approach was necessary to gauge the mindset of the question paper setters. He explained in detail the Preliminary, Mains and Interview part of the examinations. Overall, the Lecture was highly Informative and Educative to the aspiring and ever-enthusiastic students of the department. The speaker made it clear that the main objective of the exams is to unearth rough diamonds of the country to carry out the tedious Bureaucratic Business of the land. The exams, in his words, were meant not only to the elite sections of the society but to everyone in the country. Asst Prof. Tushar wakse, and Asst Prof. Sunil Shah, Convener, SMC committee accompanied the students to the NSE visit. After assembling, Asst Prof. Tushar Wakse explained to the students the itinerary of the study visit and why it was conducted. During the visit, Students participated in a two-hour training program; they were given an overview of the National Stock Exchange. The resource person Asst Prof.. Sandip Shah explained with the help of live markets, the capital market operations, derivative trading, how to be smart investors in shares and Role of NSE regulators. At the National Stock Exchange (NSE), the students were informed about the trading terminal and how the shares are fixed. They also learned how to buy and sell shares online through the trading terminal and role of the brokers in the share market. Students also learned about the futures & Option and strategies for F & O s. Students were informed about how NSE, BSE and MCX are affected by the world stock exchange, supply of foreign currency and crude oil to the national GDP and the Indian stock market. A lot of student queries relating to stock market investments were cleared by the trainer, the session concluded with the distribution of certificates to all Students.
