Session on Personality Development

BRIEF REPORT

The Department of Banking and Insurance organized a one day Seminar on Personality Development on 28th June, 2016 at 11:00 am in Room No. 12 for SYBCBI and TYBCBI students. For this seminar, the BCBI Department invited Asst Prof. Mr. Deepak Gavade, HOD of the BAMMC Department.

Welcome address was given by Asst. Prof. Mayur Mathur. Asst Prof. Deepak Gavade began the seminar by addressing on preparation for job interview and business pitch. He presented some photos of great CEOs like Vijay Shekhar CEO of Paytm, Mark Zukerberg CEO of Facebook and many more; All these personalities had one unique and common thing, i.e. 'smile'. He added that a 'smile' can lead a person towards success. So he advised the students to keep a smile on their face every time and never cry for the same problem several times. For the purpose of appearing for job interviews he presented the rule of ABC. i.e. Appearance, Body language and Communication. The main objective of the Workshop was to familiarize participants with the emerging ideas and trends on how to develop personality in the 21st century contexts.
