In response to the Vishaka Judgment passed by the Supreme Court in 1997, the University of Mumbai set up the 'University Women Development Cell (UWDC)' in 2001 with the key purpose of making the University a gender-sensitive space. The University also directed all its affiliated colleges to set up a 'Women Development Cell' at college level.

In compliance with these directives of the University, the Women Development Cell of SST College of Arts & Commerce was set up in the year 2013 with the name of Baruni (Goddess Durga). It is an active committee comprising of staff members and students of SST College of Arts & Commerce and functions with an aim to prevent Sexual Harassment, promote well being of all the female students and staff members and create a gender sensitized community within campus as well as in the society.

Baruni plays an important role in voicing opinions on important matters that affect the daily life of women students. They provide a platform where students can comfortably participate and share their views.

Objectives


- To promote general well-being of female students and teaching and non teaching women staff of SST College of Arts & Commerce



She clarified all the queries asked by the participants. The event was appreciated by the participants.



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

Students learnt a lot from this activity and it was successful with the positive feedback of the students.





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

The seminar was very much useful as it enhanced knowledge about PCOD.



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

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

Outcomes:


- 1. The female students gained confidence and found worth in the talents they hold.

It was indeed a reflection of all colors of women's lives.



Resource Person: DRISHTI Foundation,


